1. ABOUT THE INSTITUTION:

J.B. Hagjer Degree College was established in 1995. It was permitted by Assam University, Silchar (established under the central University Act III of 1989). At present, the College is temporary Affiliated to the Assam University, Silchar. The college is located at Umrongso; the remote corner of the Dima Hasao district and this is the only educational institution imparting higher education to students mostly belonging to the tribal communities in the area.

The College is named after **Joy Bhadra Hagjer** (1914-1973), who was a great political leader and educationists of Dima Hasao, for his contribution in the realm of human society, **Joy Bhadra Hagjer** earned his reputation as the **"Wonder worker"** and **"Friend of the Poor"**.

At present the college has an area of 15 bighas and the College Campus is eco-friendly which promotes peace of mind and creates conducive academic environment. Our teachers are committed and dedicated for the development of the institution by imparting their knowledge and play the role of facilitator as well as role model to our students. Due to their selfless and untiring efforts, the institution has grown from strength to strength and stage by stage in academics and infrastructure and the college caters the higher educational needs of economically, educationally and socially backward students who hail from nearly 110 villages around the Umrongso town (Garampani Constituency).

6. THREE YEARS (SIX SEMESTERS) DEGREE COURSE (TDC)

- i. J.B. Hagjer Degree College is a Pass Course ARTS college with the three year degree course (TDC) affiliated to Assam University and is governed by the Rules and Regulation of Assam University.
- ii. The Course comprises of six semester spread over a period of three years in B.A. Degree
- iii. Admission is given purely on merit and subject to Assam University (AU) regulation.

7. NUMBERS OF SEATS AVAILABLE

8. <u>GUIDELINES ON SEMESTER (THREE YEAR DEGREE COURSE)</u>

8.1 TDC CBCS REGULATION 2018 (AUS):

From the academic year **2018-2019 CBCS** has been introduced at UG (under graduate) level by the Assam University, Silchar. All the students seeking first admission into Degree course in the current year, shall come under the purview of newly introduced **CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM** (**CBCS**)

8.2 PROGRAMME OF STUDY UNDER CBCS:

The programme of study to be called Three Year Degree Course(TDC) under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and in short **TDC(CBCS)**, shall be a 6 semester programme of 3 (three) years' duration and, there shall be (two) programmes under TDC (CBCS) namely, **TDC(CBCS)** Honours and **TDC (CBCS)** General. J.B.Hagjer Degree College offers TDC CBCS General programme only.

8.3 DURATION OF PROGRAMME OF STUDY

- a) Each academic year of the TDC (CBCS) programme of study shall be divided into two semesters. The first academic year shall comprise the first and second semester, the second academic year the third and fourth semester and, the third academic year the fifth and sixth semester respectively.
- b) The odd and even semester shall consist of the period as per the Academic Calendar published by the University.
- c) Maximum duration for the completion of a TDC (CBCS) programme of study is **5** (five years at a stretch from the date of admission {i.e., 10 (ten) consecutive End Semester Examinations} as per the "Guidelines on Determination of a Uniform Spam Period within which a Student may be allowed to Qualify for a Degree" published by UGC dated October 15.2015. This Criterion shall be strictly adhered to while determining the eligibility to appear in any ESE for Arrear Paper/s, and Betterment Examination.

d) ARREAR PAPERS/PAPERS:

- i) A paper of any course will be treated as "Arrear Paper" when a student "fail to pass (F)" /
 "remained absent (AB)" In that paper of any End Semester Examination (ESE), and in the
 Grade Card such an Arrear Paper will be shown as "Yet to Pass: Paper Code."
- ii) However, a student with more than 5 (five) "Arrear Papers" of all the previous semester (First, Second and Fourth semesters) shall Not be allowed to appear in the 6th ESE. This clause be applie4d exclusively for the students appearing in the 6th ESE.

9. CHANGE OF COURSE/ SUBJECT

In the TDC (CBCS) Programme of study a student shall not be allowed to change subject during any semester of the programme after admission.

9.1 CLASS ATTENDANCE:

- a) Each student shall have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures/ Tutorials/ Practical classes in each paper of all the courses as per the recommended Course Structure of the concerned programme of study.
- b) Only the students with 75% and above of attendance in any paper (excluding "Additional GE course," if any) of the concerned semester shall be allowed to appear in the concerned paper in that End Semester Examination (ESE).
- c) Distribution of marks for Class Attendance:

19. PROMOTION RULES

- i) A candidate who has been admitted in first semester may be allowed to proceed to the next semester (upto six Semester) irrespective of number of papers in which the candidate has failed.
- ii) A candidate will get a maximum of three chances for clearing the back papers within six years i.e. 12 semesters from the date of admission to the degree course.
- iii) A candidate will be considered eligible to sit for the sixth semester examination with not more than six back papers of earlier semester classes excluding fifth semester.
- iv) Failing in any semester examination will be allowed to appear the same in the following manner:
 - a) ODD semester papers with the ODD Semester Examination.
 - b) EVEN Semester papers with the EVEN Semester Examination.
 - c) There will be no provision for Repeat or Betterment i.e. scope for appearing in any paper again for obtaining better marks.
 - d) A candidate has to clear all the papers within 12 semesters (six Years) from the year of first admission in the programme.

20. ATTENDANCE RULE FOR TDC ODD AND EVEN SEMESTER

- i) Punctuality and regularity of the students will be strictly enforced.
- ii) Attendance of the students is drawn to Act and regulation of Assam University, Silchar (AUS).
- iii) A TDC Student must attend at least 75% of lectures delivered and internal examinations held in each subjects to fill up the form for appearing University Examination. The student whose attendance is in between 75% and 65% in any subject may be considered by the Principal on genuine ground.
- iv) Attendance in a particular semester will not be taken into account in the subsequent semester.
- v) Student who fail to attend their classes for a certain period of time at a stretch on genuine, reasonable, and acceptable grounds such as serious disease or accident and related treatment involving themselves and members of their family, death of near one, academic/ sports/ cultural activities approved by the colleges etc. must apply, in writing to the Head of the Department concerned for consideration of exemption of the absence for the period, immediately after such absence. Application must be supported with testimonials/documents whenever necessary. However, such application will be considered if and only if the students has requisite 75% class attendance till the last date he/she has attended classes. Even for such cases the actual attendance must not fall short of 50%.
- vi) Students failing to attend classes for 15 (fifteen) days at a stretch in the first month of commencement of classes will forfeit their seats.

21. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

To be eligible for admission a candidate shall have to pass 10 + 2 or equivalent examination from any recognized Board/Council/University.

22. ADMISSION PROCEDURE.

- i. Application for admission into the college should be made in prescribes application form issued by the college office (with prospectus) on payment of Rs. ______. Admission into the college is made strictly in order of merit and is governed by the college Admissions rules. No request from any other source will be entertained in respect of admission. The principal's/ Admission Committee's decision is the last and final decision regarding the admission.
- ii. Students passing the qualifying examination earlier than the current year will have to submit a Gap Certificate (in original) from the Head of the Institution last attended with appropriate reason.
- iii. Properly filled up form submitted within the scheduled date shall only be considered for admission. Candidate selected for admission should get themselves admitted on the specified date of admission failing which they will forfeit their claim.

23. SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION FORM:

The application form dully completed is to be submitted to the principal of the institution on or before the submission date as per the notification accordingly. Incomplete forms are liable to be rejected.

25. FEE STRUCTURE FOR T.D.C. CLASSES

26. LIBRARY:

29. RENEWAL OF COLLEGE IDENTITY CARD

College identity cards are issued annually. Old identity cards are to be surrendered at the end of each academic session for renewal.

30. RAGGING IS ILLEGAL AND PUNISHABLE

As per the U.G.C. (University Grants Commission) guideline [No F-1-16/2007 (CPP-II), April 2009], all forms of ragging within the college campus are prohibited. Ragging is considered as a cognizable offence

under the law of the land and ragging in all its forms totally banned in the institution. As such the college Authority has set up an empowered Anti Ragging committee with the following members:-

31. CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

- Students are responsible to the principal for their behavior both in and outside the college. They are prohibited from visiting any other college without the written permission the Principal of College.
- Every student must always be decently and neatly dressed (Uniform only)
- Smoking/Tobacco is strictly prohibited in and around college.
- Students should maintain a strict silence in library, reading room and in the corridors where classrooms are located.
- Students must not loiter in the corridors when classes are going on.
- Students must not attend any classes other then their own subject, without prior permission of the Professors concerned.
- Students must take proper care of college properties and help in keeping premises neat and clean. Student must not write on the black board nor disfigure walls, table or benches. Any willful damage to the property of college will be dealt with as a breach disciplines.
- No college society can be founded without the written permission of the principal.
- No student shall start or joint any other organization without written permission of the principal.
- Students are not allowed to invite any outsider to the college campus.
- No student should, write to the press or communicate any information to it about matters relating to college administration, without permission of the principal.
- If a student remains absent more than 30 days without proper leave applications, his/her name is liable to remove from college rolls.
- Failure to observe any of the above rules will call for disciplinary action against that student.

32. <u>CODE OF CONDUCT</u>

The college expects every student to abide the following code of conduct-

i) Identity Card-

- a) Students must have their Identity Card duly filled in and signed. Students must wear these Identity Cards when they are in college premises.
 - b) Transfer of Identity Card is criminal offence the student will liable to expulsion from the college.
- ii) <u>Littering</u> in the class rooms corridors and campus is prohibited. Please use the dustbin around. Offenders will be panelized.
- iii) Sitting on the vehicles in the college compound or on A-Road is strictly prohibited.
- iv) **Loitering** or crowding in college compound is also prohibited. Students are required to remain in college campus during their free hours.
- v) <u>Mobile Phone</u> if carried by students should be in switch off mode while in class room, library and corridors of the college. If these instructions are not followed, the device will be confiscated and the concerned student will also be levied a Fine.
- vi) Anti-Ragging Act- Ragging is banned in this institution. A student involving in such activity will be expelled from the college, in addition he/she may undergo for imprisonment and Fine.
